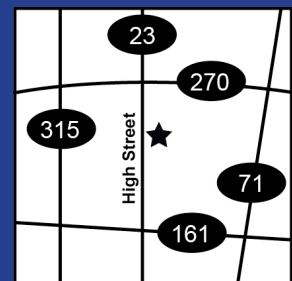

Council hears from MIC students

During its regular business meeting May 9, All Saints Congregation Council took some time to hear from first-year seminarians Terry Courter and Neil Brady, who are serving as Ministry in Context students with the congregation.

Under the current structure of the program, both will be "off" for the summer and return in the fall, and both expressed great appreciation for the opportunities they have found at All Saints during their first year. They have enjoyed the chance to challenge themselves and move out of their comfort zones and expressed their enthusiasm to return for a second year in the fall. Their final Sunday serving of this academic year for Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Bexley was May 22.

"It's been a great experience," said Courter. "We're asked to bring up issues that we see." In addition, he said, MIC students at All Saints get to take on a number of different roles, as greeters, ushers, sacristans and assisting ministers. In talking with fellow students, he said, he realizes some are more confined in their roles the first year and appreciates the chance to experience so much.



Brady said that while he doesn't like to sing in public, he was glad that Pastor Bonnie Gerber insisted he give it a try as he acted as cantor during the liturgy and has enjoyed opportunities to share sermons.

"I'm a newbie, so it's still a lot of fun for me," he said. "Terry and I are very fortunate."

All Saints will sadly say goodbye to second-year MIC student Carl Fosnaugh IV as he looks ahead to his third year of seminary and an upcoming internship but looks forward to welcoming back Courter and Brady.

In other business, Council:

- Accepted the resignation of Assistant Organist Ellen Schoepf, who graduates from Trinity Lutheran Seminary this year. She plans to move to Maine to be near her husband.

- Heard a report from Treasurer Nick Britt that reflected positive news. While the projected budget would have run a deficit, the congregation is "essentially right on." Much of the positive outcome has been due to staff's efforts to keep expenditures within tight control, Britt said. "So far, so good."

- Agreed to recognize All Saints Preschool's 20th Anniversary during 9:30 a.m. worship May 22 and present commendations to both the preschool and Director Mary Lou Kolloff.

- Reviewed a preliminary document outlining the church's mission, vision and values outlined by Council member Holly Wooden. Wooden said her goal was to take time to develop something accessible that could aid the Council, committees and staff in their decisions and in setting priorities. All agreed that creating such a document would take further discussion but applauded the effort to start the process.

Council will next meet June 13.

We had lots of fun with our July 4 celebration last year and hope to see you at this one!



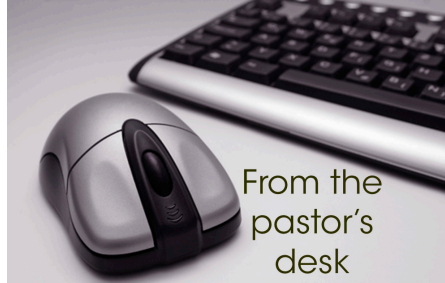
Let love, not fear, motivate action

I am looking at a pamphlet right now titled, "Judgment Day! May 21, 2011; The End of the World, October 21, 2011," and I am trying to decide how to plan my time between now and then.

This information comes from a group that predicts the end based on information from the books of Daniel and Revelation. What always saddens me about these predictions is how much of what is stated is based on fear rather than on God's love and mercy. Fear can be a strong motivator for people, but when something is done out of fear, it usually is done for the wrong reasons.

1 John 4:18 says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love."

End-of-the-world predictions often are based on misinterpretation of Scripture. For that reason, I am offering a class at 5:30 p.m. Thursdays on the book of Revelation. This is the one book in the Bible that gets misquoted more than any other, and the interpretation



is generally meant to induce fear. So, we will look at the last book of the Bible and study the text as it was meant to be studied so that we can learn from it and use its contents in a correct way for our contemporary world.

There is one thing in this pamphlet that I agree with, "The purpose of this tract is to inform you of the great urgency there now is in the world for each and every person to be reconciled to God."

In his day, the Apostle Paul would wholeheartedly agree with this statement, yet we have gotten away from a feeling of urgency in spreading the good news of Jesus Christ. If end-of-the-world predictions would drive us to live our lives differently so that the Gospel was preached in word and deed,

then good could come from such predictions. My fear is that we remain as complacent as we have always been.

"One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, 'Which commandment is the first of all?' Jesus answered, 'The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these.' Then the scribe said to him, 'You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that "he is one, and besides him there is no other"; and "to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength", and "to love one's neighbor as oneself",—this is much more important than all whole burnt-offerings and sacrifices.'" Mark 12:28-33

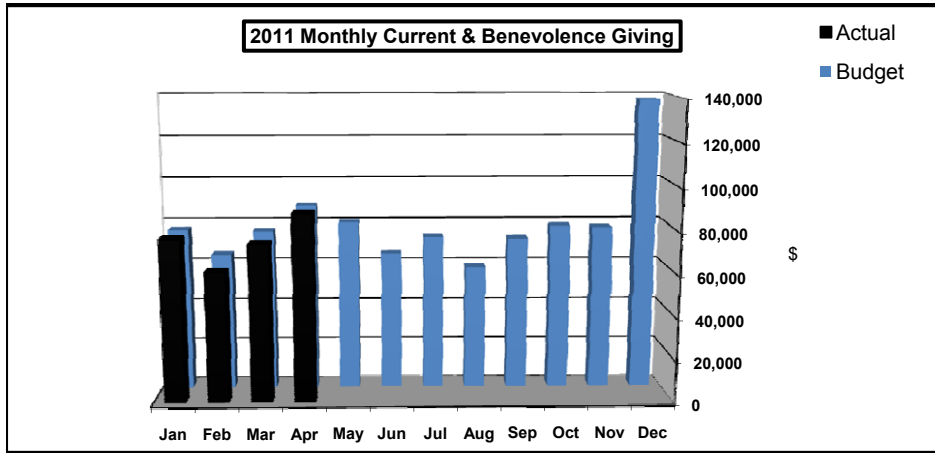

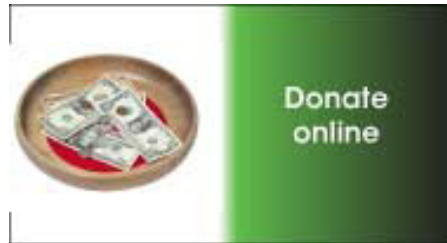
April Financial Report



April income came in at 100 percent of budget: \$88,406 vs. \$88,418. Year-to-date income is at \$301,331 vs. a projected \$306,398. In 2010, total income received was at this time was \$317,432. The difference in income from 2010 to 2011 of \$11,034 represents a decrease of 5.7 percent.

April expenses came in at \$84,431 which is higher than the budgeted amount of \$73,768. The reason for the increase is due to a \$15,000 benevolence payment that was deferred from March. Total expenses through April are \$301,834 vs. \$320,226 as projected.

In 2010, we had expenses of



\$311,664 which is \$9,830, 3.2 percent higher than this year. Year-to-date expenses exceed income by \$503. This deficit reduced current operating cash balance to \$34,470 from \$34,974 at Jan. 1.

Your financial support is important and necessary to the continued ministry at All Saints. So, when you read this, please consider supporting our many ministries.
