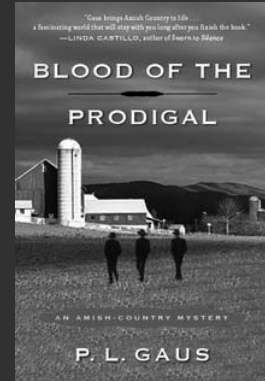
their time, money and talent to our ministry.

The color of the day is red symbolizing the Holy Spirit, who inspired Luther and who continues to inspire us today.

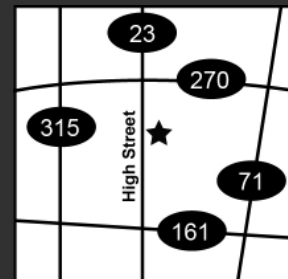
We encourage you to worship with us and to wear red in remembrance of this important day in the life of the church.

Danish philosopher Soren Kierkegaard has a parable of a wild duck: There once was a duck who, with his friends, was flying in the spring-time northward across Europe.

During the flight, he came down in a Danish barnyard where there were tame ducks. He enjoyed some of their corn. He stayed for an hour, then for a day, then for a week, then for a month, and finally, because he relished the good fare and safety of the barnyard, he stayed all summer.

But one autumn day when the flock of wild ducks again was winging its way southward, the ducks passed over the barnyard, and their friend heard their cries. He was stirred with a strange thrill of joy and delight, and with a great flapping of wings, he rose in the air to join his old comrades in their flight.

But he found that his good fare had made him so soft and heavy that he could not rise higher than the eaves of the barn.

So he dropped back again to the barnyard and said to himself, "Oh, well, my life is safe here, and the



food is good."

Every spring and autumn when he heard the wild ducks honking, his eyes would gleam for a moment, and he would begin to flap his wings. But finally the day came when the wild ducks flew over him and uttered their cry, and he paid not the slightest attention to them.

God is calling All Saints into the future, to move onward with the gospel of Jesus Christ, sharing it with those around us and the coming generations. "From the days of John the Baptist," Jesus said, "until now, the kingdom of heaven has been forcefully advancing..." (Matthew 11:12).

God's kingdom is at work within us individually and corporately, and we respond to its call and commit



ourselves to the future ... to move onward.

Council plans bells to ring Christmas Eve

During its regular business meeting Sept. 12, Congregation Council approved a request from Bell Choir members to find \$500 to fund a director for the choir through the end of the year.

When the former Bell Choir director resigned, Council opted not to fund the position in light of budget constraints. This has left the bells silent for more than a year. The choirs hope to ring for Christmas Eve given the new funding.

Gretchen Glasgow, a choir member, stressed how much the Bell Choir has meant to its members, who see this ministry as important as both a small group and part of the ministry of the congregation.

"We have a ministry. It's just a ministry that has been stifled," she said. "It's all just sitting here waiting to happen."

Council sent a request to support to find the \$500 to fund a director through Christmas Eve and promised to consider the choir's request for a director next year.

In other business, Council:

- Asked staff to revisit pro-



posals to add service times to the outdoor sign for the church. Administrative Director Gloria Bock, Facilities Director Tom Oswald and Communications Director Stacy Wendt were asked to look into options, including a proposal the Communications Committee submitted in 2008.

- Instructed Administrative Director Gloria Bock to look into new software for the church's finances. The current program is cumbersome and creates a backlog for Gloria and Bookkeeper Jodi Wilson, Council Treasurer Nick Britt explained.
- Received Pastor Bonnie Gerber's draft proposals for a staff succession plan for

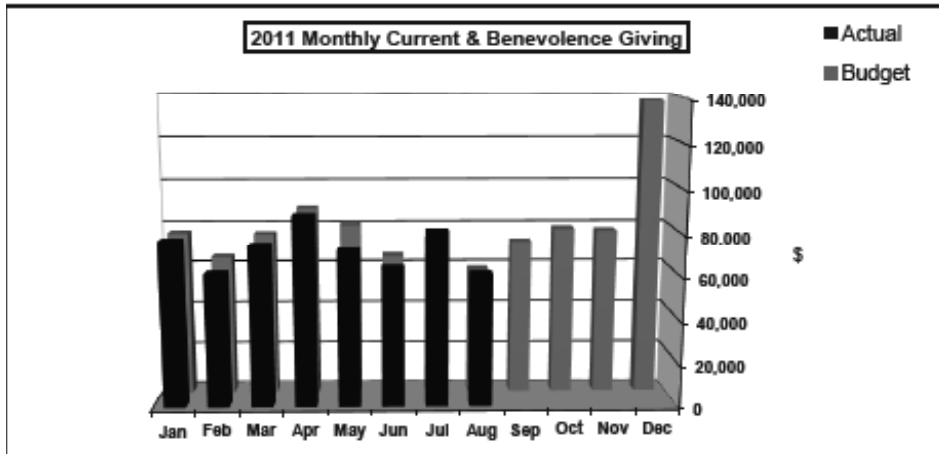

On the Numbers

August Financial Report



August income came in 105 percent of budget: \$61,205 vs. \$58,773. Year-to-date income is at \$579,753 vs. \$584,202 as projected. In 2010, total income received was \$596,385. The difference in income from 2010 to 2011 of \$16,632 represents a decrease of 2.8 percent.

August expenses came in at \$67,131 which is lower than the budgeted amount of \$68,609.

Total expenses through August are \$568,081 vs. \$605,242 as projected. In 2010, we had expenses of \$610,674 which is \$42,593, 7 percent higher than this year. Year-to-date income exceeded expenses by \$11,672.
