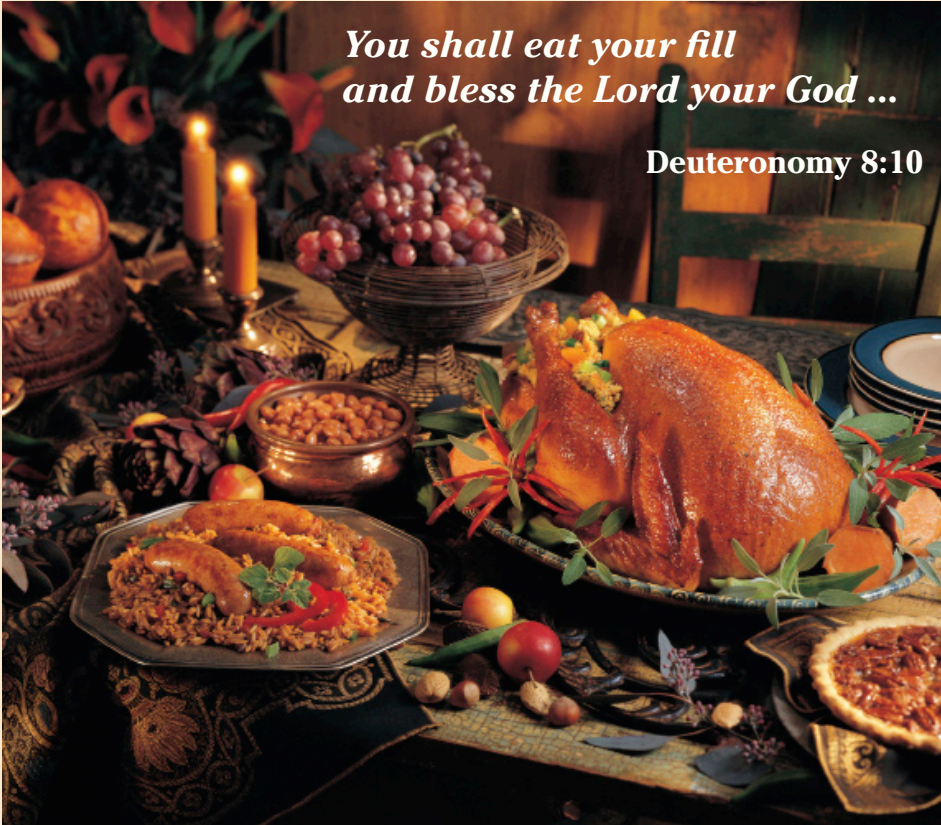

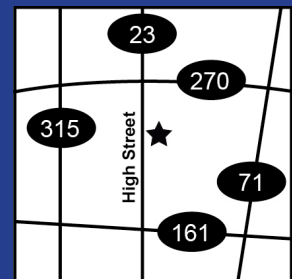

Council reviews draft of 2012 budget

During its regular business meeting Oct. 10, Congregation Council reviewed a preliminary budget proposal for 2012.

The budget process will continue through January, with reviews by Council, the Support Committee and staff. The total budget will depend largely on the response to the current Stewardship Campaign.

The total proposed budget is just under \$1 million for 2012, and the numbers will shift as the congregation's finances become more clear as pledges arrive.

The congregation will receive a suggested budget from Council



prior to the scheduled Congregational Meeting Jan. 29.

In other business, Council:

- Set the dates for the January Council meeting for Jan. 16. and the annual Congregational Meeting after 11 a.m. worship services Jan. 29.
- Reviewed a staff succes-

sion proposal that features Lead Pastor Bonnie Gerber's "dream team" as retirements and other staff shifts are made during the next several years.

- Heard a report on the 2012 Stewardship Campaign from Pastor Mike Weaver. The campaign, themed, "Onward!" is focused on encouraging the congregation to look forward to the plans God holds for us.
- Announced that Carolyn Eselgroth will fill the role of interim Director of the Bell Choir, which will ring Nov. 20 and on Christmas Eve.

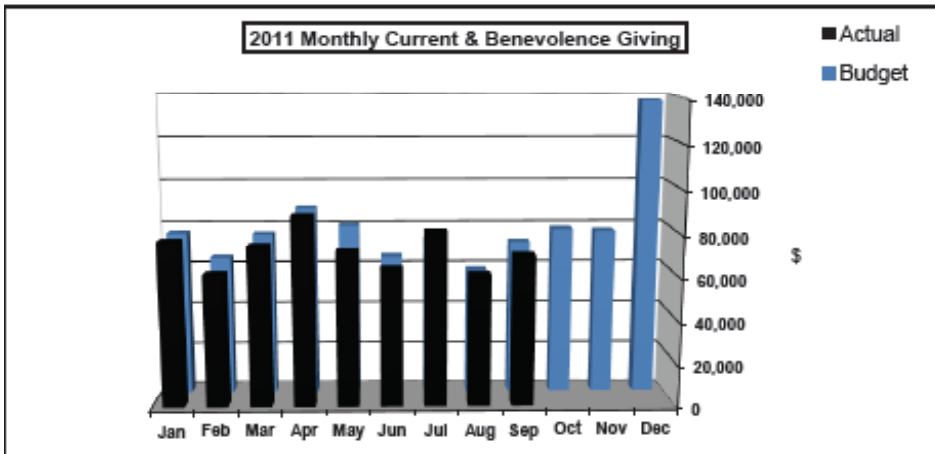

On the Numbers

September Financial Report



September income came in 97 percent of budget: \$69,263 vs. \$71,359.

Year-to-date income is at \$649,860 vs. \$656,668 as projected. In 2010, total income received was \$668,632. The difference in income from 2010 to 2011 of \$18,772 represents a decrease of 2.8 percent.

September expenses came in at \$81,771 which is higher than the budgeted amount of \$80,523. The main reason expenses are higher is due to an additional \$5,000 benevolence payment made to

the Southern Ohio Synod. The next scheduled payment to the Synod in December will be reduced by this amount. Total expenses through September are \$649,852 vs. \$685,765 as projected. In 2010, we had expenses of \$693,676 which is \$43,824, 6.3 percent higher than this year. Year-to-date income exceeded expenses by \$8.

Your financial support is important and necessary to the continued ministry at All Saints. We appreciate you considering supporting our many ministries.

Produce for Pantries

“Hunger Spreads in Suburbia”
Columbus Dispatch front page headline Oct. 17, 2011

In September of this year, 820 persons, including 326 children, 49 seniors and 445 adults came through the Worthington Food Pantry. Hundreds more visited dozens of other pantries around the city.

All Saints’ members have responded in force by contributing fresh produce as part of our Hunger Task Force fresh produce initiative. Members stepped up this year to grow produce in their own gardens, purchase produce and help tend to the All Saints on-site gardens. These efforts resulted in HUNDREDS of pounds of fresh produce that were distributed at these local points of need:

- * The Worthington Food Pantry, Clintonville Pantry, Epworth UMC Pantry, Karl Rd Pantry and the Salvation Army Sancus Blvd Pantry
- * The Columbus Parks and Recreation summer lunch program
- * A local factory that employs predominately single parents who strive to provide basics for their families
- * Two HUD sponsored senior-living facilities in and near Worthington

Recipients appreciated the carrots, peppers, cucumbers, zucchini, eggplants, beans, grapes, pears, celery, tomatoes and other fresh produce. .
