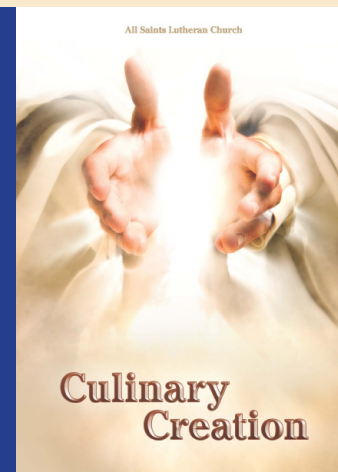

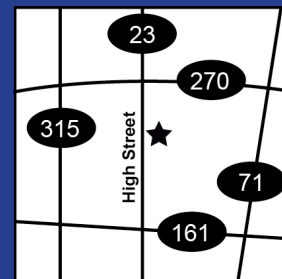

Advent a season of preparation

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

Isaiah 40:3-5

"Prepare" is the perfect word for where we find ourselves this Advent Season, as we prepare for Jesus' coming. If you have the opportunity during this Advent season, I ask for you to see how the word "prepare" is used throughout Scripture. We hear the word in Psalm 23 where our Lord as our Good Shepherd "prepares a table before me in the presence of my enemies."



We hear from the prophet Isaiah 40:3 with the reference to John the Baptist who will be the voice who "cries out" In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." This text from Isaiah is used in the three gospels of Matthew 3:3, Mark 1:3 and Luke 3:4, again referring to John the Baptist preparing the way of the Lord.

We have a most powerful text from John 14:2-3 that Jesus will "go to prepare a place for you"

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also."

In 1 Peter 1:13, we hear from Peter calling all of us to "prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed."

Throughout scripture, we receive the powerful texts of how Jesus prepares for us a table and a place for all of us and how in return we are to prepare for Jesus' coming, preparing our minds for action and discipline and setting all of our hope on the grace that Jesus has given to us when he is revealed.

May God richly bless us as we "prepare" for Christ's coming!

Council seeks funds for logo, Web plans

During its regular business meeting Nov. 14, Congregation Council forwarded a proposal to the Support Committee to update the current church logo and Web site.

Council asked the committee to see whether resources were available for the dual projects, totaling \$4,000.

Communications made the request to provide for a 50th anniversary logo for the congregation in time for the anniversary celebration Feb. 12 and to create a more navigable Web site for the congregation and potential visitors.

Some Council members expressed concern about the timing of the request but acknowledged that for work to be done in time for the Feb. 12 celebration, the request needed to be decided.

If the Support Committee can identify a funding source for the projects, All Saints will partner with Alex Ford of Crater Creative,



which produced the logos and associated materials for our Youth Ministry.

In other business, Council:

- Received a report on the 2011 Stewardship campaign, which as of Nov. 14 had raised more than 200 pledges, with 104 families increasing from the preceding year. "We felt successful," said Pastor Mike Weaver. The goal was to keep the theme of "Onward!" simple and focused.
- Received a report on a Council request to update the church's sign to include

service times. Pastor Bonnie Gerber said that she consulted with Director of Administration Gloria Bock, Communications director Stacy Wendt and Facilities Director Tom Oswald. All agreed that the cost of extending the sign was not the best use of resources at this time. Instead, the team will look at ways to make the current sign more visible through landscaping changes.

- Heard information on the Feb. 12 celebration of the congregation's 50th anniversary. The day will focus on ministry with the theme of "called and sent." During the year, All Saints will hear from several sons and daughters who have found themselves called to ordained ministry. However, the focus also includes those who take their ministries into the community on a day-to-day basis, said Pastor Gerber.

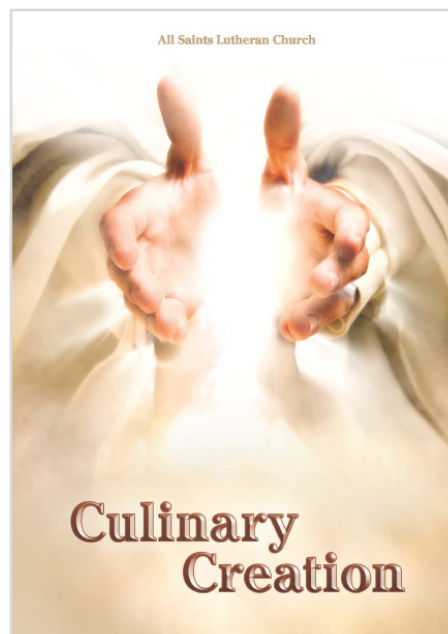
All Saints cookbooks for sale

Help Lawrence Co. families this season

With our partners at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Ironton, we will, on Dec. 10, distribute 650 food boxes to families in need in Lawrence County. All Saints plans to contribute 500 of those boxes, which will require \$15,000 in donations. Thrivent Financial for Lutherans will assist with \$1,600.

Providing even the most basic necessities of life is a struggle for many families in Lawrence County. Christmas with Dignity will provide food for families in need by giving away food boxes. Each box costs only \$30 but contains enough nutritious food to feed a family of four for about a week. Fresh produce and bread provided through Lutheran Social Services mobile food pantry will supplement the box of frozen food.

In addition to sponsoring the purchase of boxes, our congregation can support the effort by donating cookies or by traveling to Ironton for the giveaway on Dec. 10. Please contact Kay Labosky at 614-885-0112 or kayl@saintsonigh.org for additional information.

Our "Giving Tree" is in place, decorated with ornaments labeled with amounts from \$10 to \$300 and totaling \$15,000. Those who choose to donate may select a tag for whatever amount they are able to share. As long as tags remain on the tree, we will not have reached those 2,000 family members who have come to view Christmas with Dignity as a blessing in their lives.

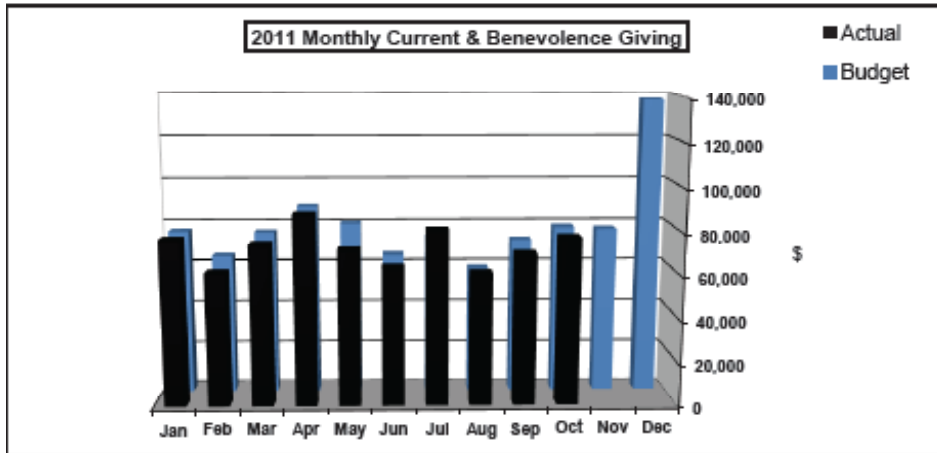

On the Numbers

October Financial Report



We're grateful for the financial support of our congregations, and pleased with where our contributions vs. our expenses have fallen this year.

As a reminder: According to IRS rules, year-end giving must be received or postmarked on or before Dec. 31 to be included on 2011 giving statements. Financial gifts/contributions received after Dec. 31 will be posted as of 2012.

The church office will be closed Dec. 26. We will be open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Dec. 27 through 30.

October income came in 99 percent of budget: \$76,716 vs. \$77,398. Year-to-date income is at \$727,427 vs. \$735,272 as projected.

In 2010 total income received was \$747,172. The difference in income from 2010 to 2011 of \$19,745 represents a decrease of 2.6 percent.

October expenses came in at \$68,598 which is lower than the budgeted amount of \$69,161. Total expenses through October are \$718,451 vs. \$754,926 as projected. In 2010 we had expenses of \$765,490 which is \$47,824, 6.2% higher than this year. Year to date income exceed expenses by \$8,976.

Your financial support is important and necessary to the continued ministry at All Saints. We appreciate you considering supporting our many ministries.

A Thank You from Jan Arthur

Last month, All Saints celebrated Jan Arthur's 30th anniversary as director of the Chancel Choir.

How can I possibly find words to describe the gratitude I feel toward all you people, my friends, my choir, my family?

What kept you going all these years?

Thirty years is a long time. Some people have asked me what kept me going so long? (I think they really wanted to give me a compliment, but I was never quite sure). My answer has always been pretty much the same: The short answer is: "Because I totally love what I do."

What specific experience most influenced your desire to do what you do?

When I was a boy of 12, I was asked to be the staff pianist at Lake Koronis Bible Camp, near Paynesville, Minn. I found out I loved to be in front, helping to lead the worship services. Little did I know how much was really involved at that point: My job was easy; I didn't even have to prepare in advance for the hymns with which I would accompany the choir and the audience in the huge auditorium night after night. Then in my home church in Barrett, Minn., I was asked to become the church organist at 13.

Another event?

The choir director at the summer camp, Gordon Carlson, a student at the University of Minnesota and I became very close buddies and later traveled together doing concerts night after night for 40 nights each summer in churches and auditoriums throughout the upper North Central states like Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, North Dakota and Michigan. He was an incredible baritone, and I still pull out some of the audio tapes we made together on the road. But

Gordon had an enormous impact on my life because he seemed to respect my ability to accompany him on the piano in ways that he said no other accompanist had done. So, that's how my story gets shortened. I found out that to be completely true to myself, I was made to be a part of worship: piano and organ work, improvisation, which I used to reharmonize familiar hymns and later developing my own personal style at the instruments.

How about your early choir history?

My choir experiences in college days at North Park University in Chicago, taught me the basics of choral conducting and doing this has excited me and fulfilled me ever since. During college, I played the organ at two different Sunday morning services.

Was there a worship experience that impacted you?

A worship event which made a huge difference in my life was when at that same summer camp I was just talking about, my mother went with me during the invitation down to the front to kneel and commit her life to Christ, as I had done the summer before. I learned then the miracle of redemption and of God's grace and goodness.

Did you have any experiences which taught you what not to do?

Another outstanding worship event occurred one summer at Lake Chautauqua in New York State, when I had been invited to play the organ for a huge service there. I was so excited and humbled to be asked. So when I got there, the pipe organ was being deconstructed so I had a little Hammond electric organ, which is how I learned to improvise and change my plans: in this case, my repertoire, but that was the day I

learned to adapt with the circumstances. And those who know me well are generally aware of this quality of flexibility, which I am so thankful for. Tom and I talk about this gift, which we both enjoy, and share, quite often. So we talk about the fact that there are so many opportunities in our field, to exercise this quality.

Did you always enjoy major choir literature as much as you do now?

I grew up with the shallowest church music you could imagine. "What a Friend we have in Jesus" was nice, but its limitation also defined the deepest I could get. I didn't grow with it.

So what changed?

Then, when I lived on the East coast in the shadow of the Twin Towers, across the Hudson in Montclair, New Jersey, for several years I got in the habit of scanning consistently the New York Times' music section to see what major works were being presented by other choirs and their directors.

I couldn't wait until the day would come when I would be able to see if I could possibly similarly present some of these "masterworks" of sacred music. This dream came to pass when my ministry at All Saints began. My pastors David Ulery and Liz Eaton so appreciated classical music, especially sacred music and both advocated for the use of this medium and encouraged me to take some risks with the choir and present some more challenging works. I couldn't believe my dream from so much earlier was beginning to come true.

My first venture into this chapter was through All Saints members Susan and Paul Isaac, when with their help I located an obscure work composed by Giocamo

Puccini at age 19, his GLORIA for choir and orchestra. For several years thereafter, the Chancel Choir and I repeated this memorable work, and soon it became our signature masterwork. I promise we'll repeat it again someday.

The question I'm often asked by singers is, "Jan, when you first introduce a new work to us, how can you possibly see the potential within us, especially as we remember how shaky we were at that first introduction to the work?"

They continue, "Often we've thought that this time you've

taken your risk with us too far! But amazingly, you bring out the best in us, and we conquer the impossible." That seems to reinforce the trust that is so necessary for anyone teaching something new.

I still love taking risks with my groups, and they've never failed me. I think they count on my believing in them. That is what truly fulfills my purpose in life. Truly, that has been the magnet that kept drawing me toward this mission all these years.

This All Saints family so shaped my musical life more than any other.
